

REGULAR MEETING, MONDAY, APRIL 2, 2007

The regular meeting of the Hope Mills Board of Commissioners was called to order by Mayor Pro Tem Gorman at 7:30 p.m. Commissioners Luther, Smith, Legge, and Collins were present. Mayor Dees was absent due to an out of town commitment.

Others present were Interim Town Manager Bob Nicholl, Town Attorney William R. Davis, Parks and Recreation Director Anita Kilgore, Fire Chief Chuck Hodges, and Police Chief John Hodges.

Police Chief John Hodges gave the invocation, and Commissioner Collins led the Pledge of Allegiance.

1. AGENDA ADJUSTMENTS, ADDITIONS, DELETIONS TO THE AGENDA.

There were none.

2. PRESENTATION: MR. JERRY THRASHER, LIBRARY DIRECTOR, THE BIG READ.

Mr. Thrasher reported the Cumberland County Public Library and Information Center will present the Big Read, a five week long celebration of *Their Eyes Were Watching God* by Zora Neale Hurston. Mr. Thrasher stated Cumberland County was one of 72 communities nationwide participating in The Big Read, an initiative of the National Endowment for the Arts, designed to restore reading to the center of American culture.

He said The Big Read program runs from March 23 until April 27, and programming is planned at various locations during the project including all public libraries, Fayetteville State University, Methodist University, Fort Bragg, Pope Air Force Base, and the Museum of the Cape Fear Historical Complex. Mr. Thrasher stated book discussions, guest speakers, music and film screenings were planned.

Mr. Thrasher presented an information sheet detailing The Big Read program. Mr. Thrasher stated 1,000 books had been purchased and given to area libraries and high schools, and the Book Club kits contained 10 books each which were available for checkout from public libraries.

3. MAYORAL PROCLAMATIONS:

a) Spring Litter Sweep - April 14-28, 2007.

Mayor Pro Tem Gorman read the proclamation and stated Mayor Dees had proclaimed April 14-28, 2007 as Litter Sweep Spring Clean-up in the Town of Hope Mills and urged all citizens to take an active role in making the community cleaner. In addition, Mayor Pro Tem Gorman reported that Mrs. Kilgore announced the Hope Mills clean-up day would be April 14th and everyone was encouraged to meet at the gazebo at 8:30 a.m.

b) Volunteer Week - April 15-21, 2007.

Mayor Pro Tem Gorman read the proclamation and stated Mayor Dees had proclaimed April 15-21, 2007 as Volunteer Week and urged all citizens to recognize the valuable contributions made by volunteers and to participate in and support their various programs and projects. Mayor Pro Tem Gorman commended

the countless area volunteers for their faithful service to the Town of Hope Mills.

c) Read To A Child Day - April 17, 2007.

Mayor Pro Tem Gorman read the proclamation and stated Mayor Dees proclaimed Thursday April 17th Read To A Child Day in Hope Mills and called upon all residents to celebrate the joy of reading by reading to a child on that day.

4. STATUS REPORT ON HOPE MILLS LAKE/DAM PROJECT.

Mayor Pro Tem Gorman reported there had been a lot of progress on cleaning the lake bed and a majority of the trees had been cut and were being removed and mulched. He stated there was free mulch available to the public and anyone interested in obtaining some mulch should contact Mr. McLaurin at the Public Works Department.

Mayor Pro Tem Gorman reported that the BB&T finance proposal was on the Local Government Commission agenda for this coming week. He expressed appreciation to Mrs. Register and Ms. Krist for their hard work preparing the information for the LGC, and stated the Board was optimistic that everything would go ahead as planned.

Mayor Pro Tem Gorman reported that Mayor Dees and Mr. Nicholl recently met with Crowder Construction Company and stated the contractor was planning to begin the spillway site preparation by the middle or the end of April. He said the construction phase would begin in May, slowly at first, but should be in full swing by the end of June or the first of July.

Mayor Pro Tem Gorman opened the floor for public comments.

Carol St. George, Dove Drive, asked what would happen if the growth comes back before the lake is filled.

Mayor Pro Tem Gorman commented the contractor stated he would return and clear any growth that comes back.

Mr. Nicholl confirmed the contractor had stated if needed, he would come back for any additional clearing.

Commissioner Legge commented he understood that vegetation grows approximately two feet per year.

5. PUBLIC COMMENTS.

Jessie Bellflowers, 3819 Sturbridge Drive, addressed the Board concerning the importance of 800 MHZ radios for the Police Department. Mr. Bellflowers presented a copy of the Homeland Security Grant to Mr. Nicholl, and stated now was the time to act and no further study was needed on this equipment.

Mr. Bellflowers briefed the audience on the available grant and stated better Police Department communication was needed to protect the residents of the community and those that protect the citizens. Mr. Bellflowers encouraged that the grant be applied for as soon as possible.

In response to a question from Commissioner Collins, Mr. Bellflowers stated Chief Hodges did have a copy of the grant.

6. CONSENT AGENDA.

Mayor Pro Tem Gorman presented the consent agenda and asked the Commissioners if there were any items they wished moved to the regular agenda for discussion.

Commissioner Luther made a motion to approve the consent agenda as presented. Commissioner Collins seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

- a) **Consideration to approve Minutes of the Closed Sessions (Sealed) November 15, 2006; February 5, 2007; February 19, 2007; and Minutes of the Special Meeting March 17, 2007, and Regular Meeting March 19, 2007.**

Minutes approved as written.

- b) **Consideration to adopt a Contract regarding the conduct of Municipal Elections.**

Ms. Louise Brigman, Administrative Election Coordinator, stated the State Board of Elections had advised all County Boards of Election to have written agreements with all Municipalities for conducting their elections. Ms. Brigman asked that the contract be executed and returned to their office.

A copy of the contract is filed in the Book of Contracts in the Town Clerk's Office.

Contract approved.

- c) **Consideration to adopt Resolution setting April 16, 2007 public hearing for voluntary annexation #07-2, 1.33 acres, located on the south side Elk Road, being the proposed South View Villas, property of Broadwell Land Company.**

7. **PUBLIC HEARING: CONSIDERATION OF A PROPOSED TRAFFIC PATTERN CHANGE FOR DOVE DRIVE - DECLARATION OF RIGHT TURN ONLY ONTO N. MAIN STREET (NC #59).**

Mayor Pro Tem Gorman opened the public hearing.

Mark Arnette, 3271 Glenmore Drive, stated his mother-in-law was killed in an automobile accident at this intersection in December 2006. He stated there had been many accidents at this intersection and a traffic light was seriously needed. Mr. Arnette stated that Hope Mills was growing fast and it did not have the ability to accommodate all the traffic.

Bruce Pross, 5773 Dove Drive, stated that the Town was growing rapidly and it was outgrowing its current traffic patterns. Mr. Pross stated he did not think a right turn only should be considered at this intersection in consideration of the residents, however, something needed to be done about the speeders on Hope Mills Road. Mr. Pross stated he felt there were other options for the traffic situation and felt that a

traffic light at this location would be the best option. In addition, Mr. Pross stated that Dove Drive was used as a thoroughfare and there was a problem with speeders.

Carol St. George, 5755 Dove Drive, said that there was a problem with constant speeders in the morning and in the afternoons. She said this had been a problem for a long time and the residents could not get out of Dove Drive onto Main Street during the afternoons up to and including around 8:00 p.m. Mrs. St. George said she was upset to know someone died because of the traffic situation, and asked the Board to consider a traffic light at this location.

Dean Riel, 5798 Dove Drive, stated that declaring a right turn only at this intersection would be a bad inconvenience for all the residents. Mr. Riel expressed concerns with speeding on this road and in the neighborhood and the safety of the children. Mr. Riel suggested installing speed bumps or motion lights, and stated he would appreciate the Board's consideration of another option other than right turn only.

There being no one else to speak in favor or in opposition to the matter, the public hearing was closed.

Commissioner Legge stated he brought this matter up previously and had been personally told by a DOT representative that they could not place a traffic light at this location.

Commissioner Legge made a motion to petition the Department of Transportation for a feasibility study for a traffic control signal on Dove Drive at Hope Mills Road for the safety of the residents. Commissioner Collins seconded the motion.

Commissioner Smith read an email that was provided from one of the residents with a comment that was received from the North Carolina Department of Transportation. Commissioner Smith quoted "there is no specific requirement for a minimum distance between traffic signals along the stated highway system. In considering the need for a traffic signal, the Department does consider the impact on other traffic signals within the vicinity as well as the roadway network itself." Commissioner Smith stated he did not feel the Department of Transportation would approve a traffic light at this location.

Commissioner Luther stated she felt that this was the only alternative and felt it would be best to work with DOT and ask for their help.

Commissioner Collins stated he had requested a copy of all the accidents from the Police Department and noted there had been 17 accidents at this location due to driver neglect.

Commissioner Collins stated he supported a traffic signal at this location, but cautioned all the citizens to please drive safely.

Commissioner Smith stated he would like to clarify his position and he was not in agreement with a right turn only, but was in favor of petitioning the Department of Transportation for a traffic light at this intersection.

In response to a question from Mayor Pro Tem Gorman, Mr. Nicholl suggested the Board adopt a resolution requesting a traffic control device and a traffic study. He stated staff could prepare the resolution to bring back for Board approval.

Attorney Davis commented the Board needed to simply direct the staff to prepare the resolution.

Commissioner Legge withdrew his motion, and Commissioner Collins concurred.

Commissioner Legge made a motion to direct the staff to prepare a resolution to the Department of Transportation requesting a traffic control device be installed on Dove Drive at Hope Mills Road. Commissioner Collins seconded the motion.

Commissioner Legge asked that Police Chief Hodges increase traffic control at this area during peak times.

The vote on the motion carried unanimously.

8. CONSIDERATION TO APPROVE THREE YEAR CONTRACT WITH MELROSE PYROTECHNICS, INC. FOR JULY 4TH FIREWORKS DISPLAY AND AUTHORIZE DEPOSIT.

Mrs. Kilgore reported that Melrose Pyrotechnics has been the Town's fireworks vendor for the last seven years at the same cost of \$7,500.00. She noted this year they requested an increase of \$1,000.00 which would make the fireworks display cost \$8,500.00. Mrs. Kilgore stated the funds were budgeted, and next year, 2008 the fee would go up to \$9,000.00 which was an increase of \$500.00 and in 2009 would cost \$10,000.00, an increase of \$1,000.00 for the fireworks display. In addition, Mrs. Kilgore stated there would be a bonus valued at \$875.00 at no additional cost. Mrs. Kilgore recommended the Board approve the three year contract with Melrose Pyrotechnics to provide the Town's fireworks display. She noted a 50% deposit would be required which would come out of the 2006-2007 budget and the remaining balance would come out of the 2007-2008 budget.

In response to a question from Commissioner Legge, Mrs. Kilgore stated that three bids were not required as this was a service contract. Mrs. Kilgore reported that a few years ago staff solicited bids, but received no responses. Mrs. Kilgore stated she was very pleased with this company and it was a good company to work with, and she had not been disappointed whatsoever in the fireworks display and in fact she had only received good comments.

Mayor Pro Tem Gorman commented that the contractor had done a good job for the Town for the past three years and he looked forward to having the fireworks back over the lake again.

In response to a question from Commissioner Luther, Mrs. Kilgore explained the bonus product.

Commissioner Legge made a motion to adopt the three year fireworks display contract with Melrose Pyrotechnics. Commissioner Smith seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

9. CONSIDERATION TO APPROVE CONCEPT OF PARKS & RECREATION CODE OF CONDUCT.

Mrs. Kilgore presented the proposed Code of Conduct and reported the Parks and Recreation Advisory Committee had approved this code of conduct pending the Town Attorney's review. She stated Attorney Davis had reviewed the Code of Conduct and reported everything looked good to him. She stated all concerns discussed by the Parks and Recreation Advisory Committee had been addressed. In addition, Mrs. Kilgore reported the Code of Conduct had been adopted by the Fayetteville/Cumberland Parks and Recreation Department, and Maxey Dove had been very instrumental in bringing this code of conduct forward and would like to see it implemented in the Town as well.

Mr. Nicholl stated if the code of conduct meets Board approval, he recommended the Board concur with the concept of the code and direct staff to prepare an ordinance amendment and bring the amendment back to the Board for formal adoption.

Commissioner Legge stated he had some serious problems with this Code of Conduct and just because the City of Fayetteville did it did not mean that the Town of Hope Mills had to have it as well. Commissioner Legge agreed he thought the Town did need to have some rules and regulations in place but felt that this code of conduct as proposed was harsh in some areas.

Following discussion, **Commissioner Legge made a motion to send the proposed Code of Conduct back to the Parks and Recreation Advisory Committee to work out better terminology.**

Following additional discussion, Mrs. Kilgore briefly reviewed the offenses and penalty clauses.

Commissioner Legge stated he had serious concerns with the suspension rule that could not be appealed. He stated he had reservations that there was no appeal process.

Commissioner Smith made comments relative to defining the rude gestures or expressions.

Commissioner Luther remarked that the Parks and Recreation programs were for the children's enjoyment, the volunteers and the parents. She stated that the department needed some rules to go by or the whole purpose of the programs would be lost.

Commissioner Collins stated he thought the 10 days suspension was too strict and felt that some other discipline could be applied. Commissioner Collins stated he did feel that rules were needed, but suggested this code of conduct be referred back to the Parks and Recreation Advisory Committee for additional consideration and recommendation.

Commissioner Smith commented that probably 20 years ago the Town did not need this sort of policy but it was needed now.

Commissioner Collins seconded Commissioner Legge's motion.

Commissioner Smith remarked he felt some clarification was needed on the disgruntled expressions and rude gestures.

Commissioner Luther commented she felt that all of this was spelled out in the proposed policy.

The vote on the motion was as follows:

The motion failed.

Commissioner Luther made a motion to accept the Code of Conduct as presented. Commissioner Smith seconded.

Commissioner Collins stated the only problem he had was the 10 day suspension rule.

10. CONSIDERATION TO APPROVE P&R ADVISORY COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION FOR JULY 4TH (WEDNESDAY) CELEBRATION - PARADE TO BEGIN AT 10:00 A.M. WITH ALL OTHER EVENTS FOLLOWING.

Mrs. Kilgore reported that currently the Parks and Recreation staff was working with the Advisory Committee to organize another successful 4th of July Celebration and this year the 4th of July falls on a Wednesday. Mrs. Kilgore stated that since 2004 the parade has been held at 3:00 p.m., and due to the high temperatures, it has been requested that the parade be moved back to 10:00 a.m. as it was before 2004. Mrs. Kilgore stated the Parks and Recreation Advisory Committee considered this matter at its March 27th meeting and voted that the parade be moved to 10:00 a.m. for the July 4th Celebration with all of the other events beginning immediately following the parade.

Mrs. Kilgore along with the Parks and Recreation Advisory Committee recommended the Board approve the change for the 4th of July parade to begin at 10:00 a.m.

Commissioner Luther made a motion for the 4th of July Parade to begin at 10:00 a.m. as recommended by the Parks and Recreation Advisory Committee. Commissioner Collins seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

11. INFORMATION ITEM: CUMBERLAND COUNTY PLANNING DEPARTMENT MEETING CONCERNING STREET RENAMING FOR THE HOPE MILLS BYPASS, APRIL 16TH, 10:00 A.M.

Mayor Pro Tem Gorman reported that the Cumberland County Planning Department had scheduled a meeting on April 16, 2007 to discuss the street naming for the Hope Mills Bypass. He stated that recent road improvements along George Owen Road, Bingham Drive, and Elk Road, has made it necessary to review the existing names for the three highways listed. In addition, he stated the North Carolina Department of Transportation had re-aligned major portions of the highways that may lead to confusion with the general public and/or emergency services if the existing names are not clarified or changed. He stated the change in process was due to the magnitude of the project and the number of agencies and or citizens it may affect.

Mayor Pro Tem Gorman reported that Commissioner Doris Luther would attend this meeting representing the Town.

12. OLD BUSINESS.

There was none.

13. STAFF CONCERNS.

Mrs. Register advised the Board that the recording system in the Board meeting room no longer worked and could not be repaired without undue cost. Mrs. Register stated she would be bringing forward a recommendation for an emergency purchase of a recording system that would be appropriate for the Board meetings.

14. OFFICIAL CONCERNS.

Commissioner Luther commented as follows:

1. Thanked everyone for attending the meeting.
2. Recognized all the volunteers present at the meeting. She stated volunteers made the Town what it is.
3. Commended the Police Department for the carnival and stated it was a fantastic event.

Commissioner Smith commented as follows:

1. Thanked Chief Hodges for bringing the invocation.
2. Thanked Mr. Thrasher for the presentation on The Big Read program.
3. Thanked all of the Dove Drive citizens who spoke. He stated traffic was a touchy situation in Hope Mills, and felt the only remedy to the problem was the decision the Board made to request DOT for a traffic light. He asked that the Police Department increase their coverage of this area. Commissioner Smith stated that the Town was growing and the Police Department needed to grow as well.

4. Thanked Mr. Bellflowers for his comments regarding the 800 MHZ radios, and stated this was something the Board needed to look into.
5. Thanked everyone for attending the meeting.
6. Invited everyone to the Life of Christ drive-thru at the South View Baptist Church Thursday through Saturday.

Commissioner Legge commented as follows:

1. Thanked everyone for attending and participating in the meeting.
2. Thanked Mr. Thrasher and Ms. Olsen with the library system for the presentation.
3. Stated the Police Department carnival was a good event and he understood the proceeds for the Police Department was very good.
4. Stated he was interested in a 800 MHZ radio system for the Police Department and the officers needed this as well in their vehicles.
5. Thanked Mayor Pro Tem Gorman for presiding at the meeting.
6. Reminded everyone of the Easter Sunrise Service at the lake Sunday at 7:00 a.m.
7. Thanked the Dove Drive area residents for speaking at the meeting and stated the Board wanted what was best for everybody. He said he hoped the DOT would assist the Town with a traffic control measure in this area.

Commissioner Collins commented as follows:

1. Thanked everyone for attending the meeting.
2. Complimented the library staff and said they were doing a great job.
3. Expressed appreciation to the Dove Drive residents and cautioned them to be very careful in this area.
4. Stated he hoped Chief Hodges would apply for the grant for the equipment. He said the Hope Mills Police Department had one of the worst communication systems in the state and the 800 MHZ radio system was needed. He asked that this grant be brought to the Manager and the Town Board. Commissioner Collins stated he was in favor of the 800 MHZ radio system.
5. Asked Mr. Nicholl and Mrs. Kilgore to look at the swimming area at the lake. He stated the docks and pier were rotten, and the replacements needed to be budgeted.

Mayor Pro Tem Gorman commented as follows:

1. Stated he appreciated Mr. Bellflowers' comments on the 800 MHZ system.
2. Thanked the Dove Drive residents for speaking and stated he appreciated their concerns. He said he hoped the Town could get something done at this intersection.
3. Announced that Dr. Dennis Sheppard had received the Boy Scouts of America Hope Mills Distinguished Citizen Award which was very well deserved.
4. Stated the new Finance Director Jeff Saleeby started today and read a brief bio. He said he was glad to have Jeff with the Town and he would be a great asset to the Town.
5. Commended the Police Department for the carnival and stated it was a great event and extremely well attended.
6. Stated the Easter Festival on Saturday was great and the kids had a great time. He expressed appreciation to the Parks and Recreation Department and staff, the Kiwanis Club and the Chamber of Commerce and stated he appreciated everyone's hard work.
7. Stated the Town's annual clean-up day for Litter Sweep would be Saturday, April 14th, and encouraged everyone to meet at the gazebo at 8:30 a.m. He stated he hoped the Board would by consensus agree to clean up the same road as they did last year and encouraged everyone to participate.
8. Expressed condolences to the family of Emily Deaver West, a life long Hope Mills resident, who passed away last week.
9. Stated it was almost time for baseball season and wished good luck to the players, parents, and coaches and said he hoped everyone had a great season.
